




Steps to Play Videos from the Settle In Website



This image is from the <u>CO toolkit</u>. The CO toolkit is a graband-go resource that teaches CO providers to incorporate key CO messages into the early resettlement services they are already providing, such as enrolling children in school or appying for health insurance. CORE's newcomer-facing Settle In resources are integrated throughout the CO toolkit.

Whenever the CO activity title includes the phrase "using the Settle In website," you will need to find and play a translated video from the <u>Settle In website</u>. This guide provides step-by-step instructions on how to play videos from the Settle In website.



Step 1: Identify the Video

This image is from page two of the third early resettlement service: personal safety orientation. This service usually occurs within 24 hours from arrival to the United States. When providing this service, you will facilitate the CO activity: Learning to call 911 using the Settle In website.

In step 6 of this CO activity, you are instructed to play the translated video: How to Interact with Police in the United States. Before playing this video for newcomers, consider watching it in a language you understand. This will help you answer their questions. Let's review how to play this video from the Settle In website.

Step 2: Find the Video







- Visit <u>Settleinus.org</u>. From the main page of the Settle In website, under "Life in the U.S.," select the topic: U.S. Laws.
- From the U.S. Laws page, select the tab: How to Interact with Police in the United States.

Select your language. Then, play the video: <u>How to Interact</u> with Police in the United States.
